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


Overhand Knot

The overhand knot is one of the simplest knot. You just have to make a loop with a string and pull one end through. Then, pull on the ends to tighten.



Lark's Head Knot


Take a single string and fold it in half. Place loop above the dowel (1). Then fold the loop down behind the folding cord (2). After that pull ends through the loop (3). In the end pull tight(4).





Square Knot


Start with two Lark's Head Knots (1). Then, cross the outer left "A" cord loosely **over** the two center strings, and **under** the outer right "B" cord (2).

Next, take the external right string (3-B) **under** both center strings, and up through the loop made by the outer left "A" string. Pull both outer strings out(4)














...and tight until the knot fits snugly against the top knot (5).






Cross the outer right "A" cord loosely **over** the two center strings, and **under** the outer left "B" string (6). Next, take the external left "B" string under both center strings, and up through the loop made by the outer right "A" string (7). Now, pull both outer strings out and tight until the knot fits with your first knot (2). Now, pull both outer strings out and tight until the knot fits with your first knot (8). You have completed a full Square Knot (9).




<u>Spiral Knot</u>


Starting with two Lark's Head Knots (1). Then, cross the outer left "A" cord loosely **over** the two center strings, and **under** the outer right "B" cord (2).


Next, take the external right string "B" (3) under both center strings, and up through the loop made by the outer left "A" string (3). Pull both outer strings.



Repeat previous steps. Cross the outer left "B" cord loosely **over** the two center strings, and **under** the outer right "A" string (4). Next, take the external right "A" string **under** both center strings, and up through the loop made by the outer left "B" string (5). Pull both outer strings (6).







Wrapping Knot

At the beginnig, grab all of the cords together vertically. Using another string, place the string in the middle (1). Take the end (2) and start wrapping the long end around the bundle of cords several times (3). Be sure to wrap it tightly and hold in place using your thumb.









After wrapping around, you should have a loop below the bundle (5- black arrow). When you have wrapped almost to the bottom of the loop, pull bottom string through the loop (5)(6) (yellow circle).

Then, pull on the top end of the wrapping cord to tighten (7). In the end trim the ends. You have completed the **Wrapping knot.**




Double Half Hitch Knot


Cross the outer left "A" cord (holding cord) loosely over the right "B" cord (working cord)(1). Next cross the cord "B" loosely **over** the cord "A"(2). Then, loop cord "B" through the loop (3) and pull tight(4).




Again, cross the outer left "B" cord (working cord) loosely **over** the "A" cord(holding cord)(5). Loop "B" cord through the loop/hole (6) and pull tight both cords. **Double Half Hitch Knot is ready (7).**



Next step to do is to grab another string "C" from the second Lark's Hed Knot (8). Cross the outer left "C" cord loosely **over** the "A" cord (9).




Loop "C" cord through the loop (10) and pull tight both cords. Repeat the same step once more. Then take another string placed next to each other as your working cord and repeat previous steps. **Always keep "A" cord as your holding cord**





Reverse Double Half Hitch Knot


Cross the outer right "A" holding cord loosely over the "B" working cord(1). Next cross the cord "B" loosely **over** the cord "A" (2). Loop cord "B" through the loop (3) and pull tight. **Half Hitch Knot is ready.**



Once more, cross the outer right "B" cord loosely **over** the "A" cord (5). Then loop cord "B" through the loop (6). Pull thight both cords. **Reverse Double Half Hitch Knot is ready** (7).









Next step to do is to grab another string "C" from the second Lark's Hed Knot. Cross the outer "C" cord loosely **over** the "A" cord (8).


Loop "C" cord through the loop (9) and pull tight both cords. Once more tie another Half Hitch Knot, repeating steps: "*Cross the outer "C" cord loosely over the "A" cord. Loop "C" cord through the loop and pull tight both cords.* Repeat the same with remaining strings next to each other. **Always keep "A" cord as your holding cord**

Macrame Plant Hanger

Materials:


- 8 cords 177 inches (4.5m) each
- 3 cords 22 inches (55cm) each
- 1x wooden ring
- 8x wooden beads
- measuring tape
- scissors

STEP1


Cut your cords into 8 equal lengths - each 177 inches (4.5m). Using all the cords, take one set of ends and put them through the ring (1). Pull them down until it matches up with the other ends. Add one 22 inches (55cm) string and thread it through the ring (2). Grab all the strings(3) and secure the top making **Wrapping Knot** using another 22in (55cm) string (4).








Start with the first "arm" of plant hanger using 4 strings next to each other
-1 arm= 4 strings (1). There will be 4 arms overall. * *Remember to put on the side added earlier 22in (55cm) string.* Start from the Spiral Knots 6 inches
-15cm long (2). Then take another four strings (3) and repeat the same.
Make overall 4 arms with Spiral Knot (6) - (1 arm= 4 strings).




STEP 3

Take first arm (1) and 4 inches - 10 cm below (2) and make a section of **Square Knots** for 2 inches - 5cm long (3). Repeat the same on each arm (4). Make sure they are even.







Grab first arm and take two strings from the middle **(longer ones)** and thread them through the wooden bead using needle threader(1)(2). **Repeat the same on each arm.**








STEP 5

Make once more section of **Spiral Knots** for 4 inches -10cm long (1). Make sure they are even. Repeat the same on each arm (2).



STEP 6


4 inches -10cm below the **Spiral Knots** section, grab two arms next to each other and take two strings from each side, which are adjecent (1) and make a **Square Knot** (2). Repeat the same for each section(3-6)








Ready **Square Knots**. Make sure thay are even(6).



As you can see something like a basket has been made






STEP 7


Once more, having two arms next to each other, take two strings from each side, which are adjecent (1) and make a **Square Knot** (2), 4 inches -10cm below the previous **Square Knot** section. Repeat the same around (3-4).







3in (8cm) below the **Square Knots** section (1) finish plant hanger using another 22 inches (55cm) string making **Wrapping Knot**(2).




STEP 9 - last one

If you remember from the beginning, you should have one string, which was left on the side at the top of plant hanger - now you have to use it. Thread the string through the wooden beads and finish them with **Overhand Knot. Plant Hanger is ready.**






Cut 4 equal lengths of cords - each 75 inches (1.9m). Using all the cords, take one set of ends and put them through the ring (1). Pull them down until it matches up with the other ends (2). Then grab all the strings (3) and secure the top making **Wrapping Knot** using one 22in (55cm) string (4).




Start with the first "arm" of plant hanger, using two strings (1) next to each other (1 arm= 2 strings). Thread both strings through the wooden beads 12in (30cm) below **Wrapping Knot** (2-3).




STEP 3

Repeat the same with remaining strings. Take two of them next to each other and 12in below thread the wooden beads(1). Make sure all beads are placed even. There will be 4 arms overall (2). Next, tie a knot under each wooden beads to secure it in place. Make an **Overhand Knot** (3-4). Repeat the same for each arm. 1 arm = 1 **Ovarhand Knot** under the beads(5).




Having two arms next to each other, take two strings from each side, which are adjecent (**red circle 1**) and make an **Overhand Knot**(2) 4 inches -10cm below the wooden beads above (3).




STEP 5

Repeat the same for remaining arms. Take two strings from each side, which are adjecent (red circle 1) and make an **Overhand Knot** (2). Repeat the same with remaining two arms and connect them. Ready four arms with **Overhand Knots** (4)













3in (8cm) below the first **Overhand section** repeat the same making another one (1). Having two arms next to each other, take two strings from each side, which are adjecent (**red circle 2**) and make an **Overhand Knot** (2). Repeat above steps to connect all the strings (3-4).



Connect all the strings which are adjecent(5) for arm 3rd and 4th(6).









Ready second part of **Overhand Knot**(7).



Next secure all the strings in place using **Wrapping Knot** - the same as at the beginning. You need a second piece of 22 in (56cm) string for this knot. Make it 4inches - 10cm below the second set of **Overhand Knots** (1-2).




In the end trim the ends slightly so that they are even(3-4). Macrame Plant hanger is ready.





Macrame Feather/Leaf




Materials:

- 1 cord 33 inches (84cm) spine
- 36 cords 12 inches (30cm) each
- 1 cord 19 inches (49cm)
- 4x wooden beads
- scissors
- spray

STEP 1


Fold the 33inches (84cm) string in half (1) and using wooden ring make a Lark's Head Knot (2). Using blue needle threader, thread the main cord through the wooden bead (3).










Take one of the 12 inches -30cm string, fold it in half and tuck it **under** the spine (main string)(1). Take another 12in string (30cm), put it in half and insert it into the loop of the top horizontal string (2). Pull it through and lay it horizontally, on top of the opposing string (3-4). After that, pull the bottom string all the way through the top string(5). Pull the strings from the both sides (6).



Your final knot should looks as on the right photo (6).









STEP 3

For the next row, you have to change the starting side(1). Lay the string reverse. Lay the first folded string **under** the main string and thread folded string into its loop(2). Pull the lower string through the top loop (3).



Pull the cords from both sides (4). Continue the same steps for the rest of the strings to the bottom. There should be 18 knots (5). Then very carefuly brush out each string (6).



Give it spray (it may be common hairspray)(8). After that, leave the feather for a while to dry. Then you can give it a final trim(9). Don't rush and do it at your discretion, so that the shape resembles a feather/leaf (9).







STEP 4

To the wooden ring add one 19 inches- 49cm string and make a **Lark's Head Knot**(1). Thread the string through the wooden beads using needle threader(2). Make it for both strings, so 4 beads should be used.

In the end secure them using **Overhand Knot** (4). Feather is ready.









Macrame Bookmark (Video Tutorial) click here Materials: 1x 12 inches (30cm) cord 1x 16 inches (40cm) cord 4x 65 inches (4x 165cm) cord 1x bead scissors measuring tape

STEP 1


Use 12 inches (30cm) string as first (1). Place it horizontally to the ground. Then fold in half all the 65 inches (165cm) strings and make section of **Lark's Head Knot** (2) on the horizontal string. Starting with the left section (Two Lark's Head Knots-yellow circle)(3), make a **Square Knot** (4).








Repeat the same on the right side. (Two Lark's Head Knots -yellow cirlce)(5), make a **Square Knot**(6).




STEP 2

For the central section (four middle strings -yellow cirlce)(1), make another **Square Knot**(2). Then, starting from the left section(3) repeat previous steps (left-right-center Square Knot. Repeat the steps for 8 inches -21cm (4).




Take two middle strings and thread them through the wooden bead using needle threader(5)(6).




Now you may make **Diagonal Double Half Hitch Knot**(1) on the left and

the right side(2). **NOTE:** *If you think this step may be difficult for you, you may skip it to picture number 3 and finish with the* **Wrapping Knot** (3).



Secure the bottom making **Wrapping Knot** using 16 inches (40cm) string(4). Trim the ends. In the end take the top horizontal string and thread it through the wooden bead(5). Finish with **Overhand Knot** (6). **Bookmark is ready :)**




Macrame Keychain

Materials:

- 2x 50 inches (127cm) cord
- 1x Keyring
- 1x Wooden Bead
- scissors
- measuring tape


STEP 1


At the beginning, loop the 50 inches -127cm strings through the keyring using Lark's Head Knot (1). Leave outside strings longer than the inside strings(2). 1/4 for inside strings, 3/4 for outside strings. Then, make a section of six Square Knots (3-4).




Step 2

Take two strings from the middle -marked as yellow circle(1) and thread them through the wooden bead(1). Then make another six **Square Knots** and finish with **Overhand Knot** - red arrow (3).









In the end, you can use **Overhand Knot** (1) to secure the strings or finish with **Wrapping Knot**. Trim and brush out the ends. Keychain is ready!


Materials:

- 10 cords 125 inches (3.2m) each
- 1x wooden dowel
- 12x wooden beads
- measuring tape
- scissors


STEP 1

Cut 10 strings 125 inches (3.2m) long. Using these cords make 10 **Lark's Head Knots** (1). Make sure the ends are even. Use 8 wooden beads 12mm. Thread the cord through them. Four on the left and the right side. Two middle **Lark's Head Knots** leave "empty" (2)







Starting from the left string of the right **Lark's Head Knot**, make **Double Half Hitch Knot** going diagonally. Cross the left "A"(holding cord) string loosely over the right "B" string - **working cord**(3). Next cross the cord "B" loosely over the cord "A"(4-5).




Then, loop cord "B" through the loop (6) and pull tight. Make once more the same --> cross the cord "B" loosely over the cord "A"(7-8). Then loop cord "B" through the loop (9) and pull tight.



Take next string from the left **Lark's Head Knot** and make another **Double Half Hitch Knot** (10) and repeat previous steps. Then continue with remaining strings next to each other. Rember tu use cord **"A" as your holding cord** (11).




Repeat the same going diagonally to to right side. *B-right string from the right Lark's Head Knot as the working cord*






STEP 3

Starting with the four middle strings, make a **Square Knot** (1). Then, take two left strings from the ready **Square Knot** (2), and make another one on the left and the right side. Always grab two adjecent strings (two from ready **Square Knot**, and the right/left strings from the other pair. Complete on both sides (3)




STEP 4

Leave on the side two outer strings. Then, thread the third string through the bead(1). Next, make a **Square Knot** using these four strings (**yellow** ______ circle) and repeat the same on the right side (2-3)







Repeat the same steps going to the center. Then, using four middle strings, finish with the **Square Knot** (4)




STEP 5

Take the left "A" string. **It's going to be your holding cord.** Make a **Double Half Hitch Knot** going diagonally to the center (1-4). Then make the same on the left side (5).








Finish **Double Half Hitch Knot** connecting strings from the left and the right side (6). Connect them with **Double Half Hitch Knot** (7).






STEP 6

Take four middle strings and make a **Square Knot** 1 inch- 2.5 cm (1) below the **Double Half Hitch Knot** (2). Make section of **5 Square Knots** next to each other using four separate strings from the left and the right side(3).



For the 2nd row, leave on the side two strings and make another row of **4 Square Knots**, by using four separate strings (4-5).






*For the 3rd row, leave on the side another two strings and make a section

of **3 Square Knots**

*For the 4th row leave on the side another two strings and make a section

of **2 Square Knots**


*For the 5th row use four middle strings and finish with **1 Square Knot**(6).




STEP 7


Below the **Square Knots** section, make another **Double Half Hitch Knot** on the left and the right side. Connect them on the same way as before(1)(2). This is how **Double Half Hitch Knot** section should looks (3).








Using four middle strings, make a **Square Knot** 1inch -2.5 cm below the **Double Half Hitch Knot**(1). Grab two adjecent strings (two from already done **Square Knot** (2), and the right/left strings from the other pair and make **Square Knots** section (2). Repeat the same on the both sides (3).





STEP 9

Repeat steps from 34-36 page. Leave on the side, two outer strings. Then, thread the third string through the bead(1). Repeat the same on the right side. Next grab these four strings (**yellow circle**) and make a **Square Knot**(2). Then take two adjecent strings (two from ready Square Knot and the right/left strings from the other pair and make **Square Knots** section(3). Completed section (4).



In this step you have to make another **Double Half Hitch Knot** (first section) on both sides(1). Repeat once more the same to have two **Double Half Hitch Knot** sections (2).





STEP 11


Grab four middle strings and make 1in - 2.5 cm below section of **5 Square Knots** next to each other (using four separate strings-yellow circle)(1-2)






Step 12

For the 2nd row, leave on the side two strings. Take four separate string and make a section of **4 Square Knot - yellow circle**, by using four separate strings next to each other (2)






*For the 3rd row, leave on the side another two strings and make a section of **3 Square Knots**

*For the 4th row leave on the side another two strings and make a section of **2 Square Knots**.

*For the 5th row use four middle strings and finish with

1 Square Knot(3).



Step 13

Measure 4.5 inches-12 cm and cut the strings on the left and the right side. Cut each subsequent string (going towards the center) 0.4 inch -1cm less than the previous one (1). This is what the strings should look like after the trimming (2).



Step 14

In the end, you can slightly comb each string. Wall Hangng is ready :)



Macrame Wall Hanging #2



Materials:


- 10 cords 74 inches (1.9m) each
- 4 cords 35 inches (89cm) each
- 1 cord 21inches (55cm)
- 1x wooden dowel
- measuring tape
- scissors

STEP 1


Cut 10 strings 74in (1.9m) long. Using these cords make 10 Lark's Head Knots (1). Make sure the ends are even. Take four strings from the left side (red circle) and make a Square Knot(3)



Repeat the same for remaining strings. You should have **five Square Knots** next to each other(4). Take the very external two strings from the left and the right side and leave them on the side(5). Next, take four string next to each other(6) and make a **Square Knot** (7) - red circle.




Repeat the same to have four Square Knots in this row(8)





STEP 2

For the third row, once more leave on the side very external two strings from the left and the right side -red circle(1) and make a Square Knots. In this row should be **3 Square Knots**. For the fourth row leave on the side another two strings on the side from left and the right side. Do the same for the fifth row. This is how should look your first part of the project (2).




Take the left string **"A" holding**. It's going to be your main cord. Make a **Double Half Hitch Knot** going diagonally to the center (1-5).



STEP 4


Repeat **Double Half Hitch Knot** going diagonally to the center on the right side (1-2). Once more repeat **Double Half Hitch Knot** for both sides, so you should have **two Double Half Hitch Knot** sections one by one(3).




STEP 5 Leave 3.5 inches -9cm gap(1)



Take four strings next to each other from the left side and make a **Square Knot** section(1-2). Repeat the same on the right side. Then, leave on the side first two strings from the left side and take two adjecent strings (two from the first **Square Knot**, and the right strings from the other pair and make a **Square Knot**(3-4). For next **Square Knots** do the same- leave two outside strings and work on two adjecent to meet in the middle.




Repeat the same on the right side to meet both sides in the middle and finish with **Square Knot** (5-6). Knots should be placed one by one going diagonally.




Below the first section of **Square Knots**, make another one, exactly the same as first one. At this point you'll have two **Square Knots** section one by one going diagonally(7).




Right now, take the strings from the very left side(1) and make another **Double Half Hitch Knot** section on the left and the right side(2). The same as earlier. Repeat the same on the right side(3-4). When you meet in the middle, make a final **Double Half Hitch Knot** and connect both sides (5-6).



Below the **Double Half Hitch Knot** section, make another one. You have two **Double Half Hitch Knot** sections one by one(A)(B).



3 inches-8cm below the **Double Half Hitch Knot**(1) make a section of **Square Knots** laid horizontally(2). Grab all four strings and make **Square Knot**. Next to it grab another four strings and repeat the same till the end of the side-(red arrow).




STEP 9


Now leave on the side two strings from the left and the right side (red arrows marked in the picture), and once more make **Square Knots** section(2). Repeat till the end of the side. Then, starting from the left side, grab adjecent strings (first four strings) and make another **Square Knot** section (3-4).




Grab first row of **Square Knot** - **yellow circle** (5) and make **three Square Knots** one by one(6).



Take the two middle strings from below Square Knots and thread them through the hole at the top of the first Square Knot(red circle)(1-2).
Pull the strings all the way through(3). Then, using the same four strings from the middle, tie a Square knot to lock in the Berry Knot (4).



Repeat the same till the end of the side. Make three **Square Knots**(5), then take the two middle cords and weave them through the hole at the top of the first **Square Knot - red circle** (6).




Pull all the way through (7). Then, using the same 4 strings, tie a **Square Knot** to lock in the **Berry Knot**. Repeat the same with 3 other sections. Overall there should be **5 Berry Knots** (8).






Final part is to make **Spiral Knot** section at the top. Take two 35 inches (89cm) strings and start with **Lark's Head Knot** on the wooden dowel(1).

Inner strings 7 inches - 18cm long and outer string 24 inches -61cm long. Now make Spiral Knot section around 3.5-4 inches -10cm long (2). Repeat the same on the right side(3). Now connect both sides in the middle.



Grab all the strings and finish them with **Wrapping Knot** using 21 inches (55cm) string. Ready Wrapping Knot (red circle). Trim the ends from the top and the bottom. **Macrame Wall Hanging is ready :**)
